FAQ

1. Q: What does it mean to sponsor an EA Scholar for the year?

A: The donor will give a donation of \$250 in its entirety by December 31st and is committing to be in prayer for this student throughout the year.

2. Q: What's the commitment?

A: Please consider walking with your EA Scholar all the way through graduation – up to a 6 year commitment. Our hope is that each EA Scholar will graduate and open doors to their future. Your commitment will eliminate the barriers of economics closing those doors or making it seem overwhelming.

3. Q: What does this scholarship provide to the student?

A: This scholarship will cover the student's school uniform, shoes, textbooks and school supplies for the entire school year and provide access to use of the computer lab and tutoring center.

4. Q: What is expected of the student I am sponsoring?

A: The students are held to an above average standard. They must keep their GPA above 80%, have good behavior in the classroom and are expected to be a leader. Every EA Scholar will spend at least 2 hours a week in the EA Learning Center utilizing the resources available.

5. Q: How will sponsoring an EA Scholar make an impact for the Kingdom?

These students will be in a healthy environment at the Learning Center and interacting with our dynamic, Jesus-loving staff, as well as attend a Bible Study. Our goal is to grow committed followers of Christ. All of this, along with your prayers, we pray will deepen their love for the Lord.

6. Q: What do I, as the donor, receive?

A: An initial profile of the student, with a picture, so that you can use it to pray for your student. We will also provide you with a quarterly update of the student's progress.

7. Q: May I give gifts to the student I am sponsoring?

A: Yes! Please stay within these parameters of a gift: letters, pictures of you and your family, a reading book or devotional book (in Spanish!) or a journal. To send a letter or gift, please email: education@eahonduras.org and we will tell you where to send it.

8. Q: How can I keep in touch with my student?

A: There are two ways – you can send them an email (education@eahonduras.org), and we will get it to him/her. You can also send him/her snail mail through a team that is coming down.

9. Q: Can I meet my student?

A: Yes! If you are coming down on a work team or as a volunteer and would like for us to arrange for you to meet your student, please notify us 1 month ahead of time at: education@eahonduras.org for us to prepare for the meeting. A meeting with your student will either be in the student's house or in the tutoring center – and with the help of a translator.

10. Q: How does the Honduran school year work?

A: The Honduran school year runs from February to October. Most schools have 6 hours of classes per day. Most rural schools have multi-level classrooms – often 3 elementary grades taught by one teacher, averaging 33 students per teacher. The government recently increased the required years of school from 6th grade to 9th grade.
